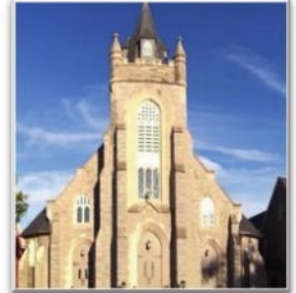

Be Prepared, Not Hassled!

Today, the Church begins a new liturgical year with the Season of Advent. As we cultivate parish renewal through intentional discipleship in the Lord, each of us has a choice in the month of December—to allow Wal-Mart, Target, and the pop culture to set the tone and agenda for us, or to choose to follow the wisdom of the Church and the promptings of the Holy Spirit.

This wondrous season of Advent is much more than the necessary time to wait for Christmas Eve to arrive. The Church challenges us to watch, wait, and prepare ourselves. And notice, it does not have us look back, but rather reflect on how we are living each new TODAY in light of the Eternal Forever. Yet, many people end up simply doing things. They run from store to store buying Christmas presents; scurry about decorating their homes inside and out; bake dozens and dozens of Christmas cookies; and tire themselves out with many Christmas parties before December 24th.

In contrast, the Church invites us to be prepared, not hassled. Perhaps, people think they are preparing with all the above mentioned activities; yet many are more hassled than prepared. That is because they are preparing for the wrong thing. Instead of preparing a fuller relationship with the Lord Jesus, they prepare for a series of activities, which in fact have little meaning without Christ.

Instead, the Church invites us to recapture the attitude of the earliest Christians, expressed in the beautiful acclamation, ***Maranatha***, which translates, ***Come, Lord Jesus!*** These earliest Christians longed for their Risen Lord, above everything else, to return from heaven, soon and very soon. Consequently, they lived and prepared for the Lord to be a fuller part of their lives. They longed to Know Him, Love Him, and Follow Him completely. We, too, can prepare for the Lord to be a fuller part of our lives. Please consider:

- Attending Mass during the week to be formed by the Advent Scriptures and fed by Christ's Body and Blood.
- Eating dinner together as a family and using an Advent wreath to mark the progression of days to Christmas.
- Planning to go to Confession to experience God's mercy.
- Choosing some form of service to others, especially the most in need.
- Using Advent resources online to deepen your prayer life.
- Signing up for a time slot in the Adoration Chapel

¡Esté Preparado, No Molestado!

Hoy, la Iglesia comienza un nuevo año litúrgico con el tiempo de Adviento. A medida que cultivamos la renovación parroquial a través del discipulado intencional en el Señor, cada uno de nosotros tiene una opción en el mes de diciembre: permitir que Wal-Mart, Target y la cultura popular establezcan el tono y la agenda para nosotros, o elegir seguir la sabiduría de la Iglesia y la inspiración del Espíritu Santo.

Esta maravillosa temporada de Adviento es mucho más que el tiempo necesario para esperar a que llegue la Nochebuena. La Iglesia nos desafía a velar, esperar y prepararnos. Y fíjense, no nos hace mirar atrás, sino reflexionar sobre cómo estamos viviendo cada nuevo HOY a la luz del Eterno Futuro. Sin embargo, muchas personas terminan simplemente haciendo cosas. Corren de tienda en tienda comprando regalos de Navidad; se apresuran a decorar sus casas por dentro y por fuera; hornee docenas y docenas de galletas navideñas; y se cansan con muchas fiestas y parrandas navideñas antes del 24 de diciembre.

Por el contrario, la Iglesia nos invita a estar preparados, no a ser molestados. Quizás, la gente piensa que se está preparando con todas las actividades mencionadas; sin embargo, muchos están más fastidiados que preparados. Eso es porque se están preparando para lo incorrecto. En lugar de preparar una relación más plena con el Señor Jesús, se preparan para una serie de actividades, que de hecho tienen poco significado sin Cristo.

En cambio, la Iglesia nos invita a recuperar la actitud de los primeros cristianos, expresada en la hermosa acclamación, ***Maranatha***, que se traduce: ***¡Ven, Señor Jesús!*** Estos primeros cristianos anhelaban que su Señor Resucitado, por encima de todo, regresara del cielo, pronto y muy pronto. En consecuencia, vivieron y se prepararon para que el Señor fuera una parte más plena de sus vidas. Anhelaban conocerlo, amarlo y seguirlo completamente. Nosotros también podemos prepararnos para que el Señor sea una parte más plena de nuestra vida. Por favor considera:

- Asistir a la Santa Misa durante la semana para ser formado por las Escrituras de Adviento y alimentado por el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo.
- Cenar juntos en familia y usar una corona de Adviento para marcar la progresión de los días hasta la Navidad.
- Planear ir a la confesión para experimentar la misericordia de Dios.
- Elegir alguna forma de servicio a los demás, especialmente a los más necesitados.
- Registrarse para un cupo en la Capilla de la Adoración

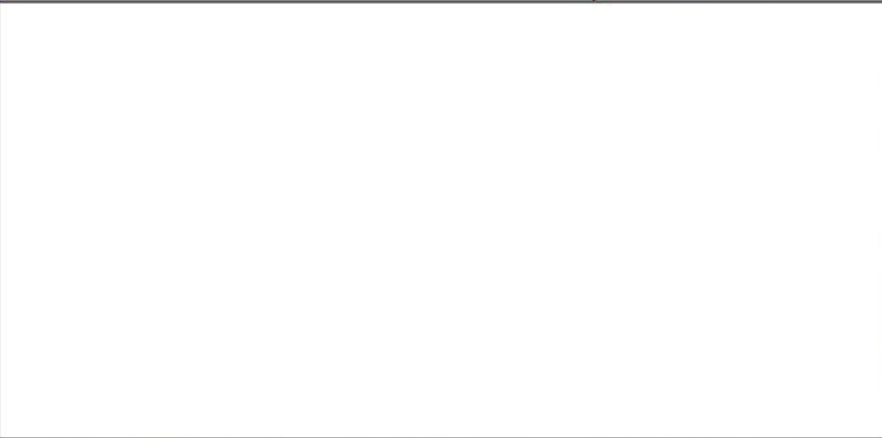
