## Following our Mother's Advice: "Do Whatever He Tells You"

Today's gospel links the conclusion of the Christmas season with our entrance into Ordinary Time. Revealed by the light of the star and the Voice from heaven, Christ today reveals himself to his disciples in this miraculous sign at the wedding feast of Cana. But this miracle was much more than providing more wine for a wedding feast. This first of his signs demonstrated his power and revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him. "Signs" in Saint John's Gospel highlight who this Jesus Christ really is, so that his disciples grow in greater faith in him.

The goal of these signs is fuller discipleship through deepening faith in Jesus Christ. Christ's greatest sign, of course, was his death and resurrection. With the first of his signs, let us not overlook how his disciples came to greater faith. The mighty work of changing large, stone water jars into vessels filled with wine greatly impressed his disciples. But how did this miracle even begin? Mary, the Mother of Jesus, the Mother of God, asked her son for help. Then she told the serv-

ants, "Do whatever he tells you." Mary serves as an important model for **Intentional Discipleship** and for powerful Intercession. Even though the Lord knew his hour had not yet arrived, he ceded to his mother's request and resolved the newly married couple's dilemma.

In the superabundance of this miraculous SIGN — more than 120-180 gallons of the best wine of the wedding—we can recognize the precursor to the New and Eternal Covenant inaugurated in His Blood. Among the many ways in which we "Do whatever he tells you," one that rises above all the rest is to "Do this in memory of me." In our participation in the Holy Mass, not only do we receive the One who is the Word-made-Flesh for us, not only do we fulfill the command to "Do this in memory of me," but we also make of ourselves a living offering and SIGN to the Father that we are striving to do whatever Jesus tells us on a daily basis.

May we become Intentional Disciples of the Lord through Mary's example and intercession! Please consider relying on her more through praying the Holy Rosary. Please consider finding ways to attend the Holy Mass more frequently during the week, and thus respond to the LORD's superabundance of love, by doing this in memory of him, even daily.

# Siguiendo el Consejo de Nuestra Madre: "Hagan lo que Él les diga"

El evangelio de hoy vincula la conclusión del tiempo de Navidad con nuestra entrada al Tiempo Ordinario. Revelado por la luz de la estrella y la Voz del cielo, Cristo se revela hoy a sus discípulos en esta señal milagrosa en las bodas de Caná. Pero este milagro fue mucho más que proporcionar más vino para un banquete de bodas. Esta primera de sus señales demostró su poder y reveló su gloria, y sus discípulos comenzaron a creer en él. Los "signos" del Evangelio de San Juan destacan quién es realmente este Jesucristo, para que sus discípulos crezcan en una mayor fe en él.

El propósito de estas señales es un discipulado más completo a través de una fe más profunda en Jesucristo. La mayor señal de Cristo, por supuesto, fue su muerte y resurrección. Con la primera de sus señales, no pasemos por alto cómo sus discípulos llegaron a una mayor fe. La poderosa obra de convertir grandes tinajas de piedra para agua en vasijas llenas de vino impresionó mucho a sus discípulos. Pero, ¿cómo comenzó este milagro? María, la Madre de Jesús, la Madre de Dios, pidió ayuda a su hijo. Luego les dijo a los sirvientes: "Hagan lo que él les diga". María

sirve como un modelo importante para el **Discipulado Intencional** y para la poderosa intercesión. Aunque el Señor sabía que aún no había llegado su hora, cedió al pedido de su madre y resolvió el dilema de la pareja de recién casados.

En la sobreabundancia de este SIGNO milagroso — más de 120-180 galones del mejor vino de las bodas— podemos reconocer el precursor de la Nueva y Eterna Alianza inaugurada en Su Sangre. Entre las muchas formas en las que "Hagan lo que él les diga", una que se eleva por encima de todas las demás es la de "Hagan esto en memoria mía". En nuestra participación en la Santa Misa, no sólo recibimos a Aquel que es la Palabra hecha Carne para nosotros, no sólo cumplimos el mandato de "Hagan esto en memoria mía", sino que también nos convertimos en ofrenda viva y SEÑAL al Padre de que nos esforzamos por hacer lo que Jesús nos dice a diario.

¡Que podamos convertirnos en Discípulos Intencionales del Señor a través del ejemplo y la intercesión de María! Considere confiar más en ella rezando el Santo Rosario. Considere encontrar maneras de asistir a la Santa Misa con más frecuencia durante la semana, y así responder a la sobreabundancia de amor del SEÑOR, haciendo esto en memoria de él, incluso a diario.


#### **SMALL GROUP FAITH SHARING**
