Listening to the Beloved Son; Forming One's Conscience

Today as Jesus foretells his resurrection by proclaiming, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up," he reveals that he is about to establish an even better relationship between God and man than the Jews had, symbolized by their Temple worship. This **New and Eternal Covenant** will not depend on the Temple and its sacrifices, but will instead be solely grounded in the temple of Christ himself offered on the cross and raised from the dead. This is why the Father commanded us last Sunday to listen to his Son.

This New and Eternal Covenant in the blood of the Lamb makes us God's children, with the capacities:

- ◆ to grow more deeply and closer to the Lord,
- to be filled fully with utter joy in this filial relationship,
- to surrender more completely and obediently to His will,
- and to love selflessly as Christ loves us.

The Father's Holy Will guides us as his children. Our conscience assists us recognize and follow this Divine Will.

Our conscience is the practical judgment of what is good and evil and of what is God's will for us. The Second Vatican Council taught, "In the depths of his conscience, man detects a law which he does not impose upon himself, but which holds him to obedience." Formation of conscience, then, entails attuning oneself to the Truth God reveals to mankind. The formation of one's conscience is an ongoing process. Each person has the serious responsibility to promote this process of their conscience formation. Additionally, parents have the serious duty to form the conscience of their children.

How do we promote the formation of conscience?

- Acknowledging Natural law, which corresponds to the nature that the Creator gave to his creatures. For example, the dignity of human life prohibits murder.
- Understanding Divine Law, which is the law God reveals to us in the Scriptures, like the Ten Commandments & Jesus' Sermon on the Mount.
- Knowing and following Church law which guides us to apply Divine law in particular ways.
- Studying Church teaching.
- Obedience to civil law for the good order of society.
- ♦ Considering WWJD What would Jesus Do?
- Recognizing what is the reasonable thing to do.
- Considering the consequences of a particular action.
- Praying for guidance

Conscience is our guide; for it to guide us well, we need to form conscience well.

Escuchando al Hijo Amado; Formando la propia conciencia

Hoy, cuando Jesús predice su resurrección al proclamar: "Destruid este templo y en tres días lo levantaré", revela que está a punto de establecer una relación aún mejor entre Dios y el hombre que la que tenían los judíos, simbolizada por su adoración en el Templo. Este **Nuevo y Eterno Pacto** no dependerá del Templo y sus sacrificios, sino que estará cimentado únicamente en el templo del mismo Cristo ofrecido en la cruz y resucitado de entre los muertos. Por eso el Padre nos mandó el domingo pasado escuchar a su Hijo.

Este Nuevo y Eterno Pacto en la sangre del Cordero nos convierte en hijos de Dios, con capacidades:

- para crecer más profundamente y más cerca del Señor,
- llenarse plenamente de absoluta alegría en esta relación filial,
- ♦ rendirse más completa y obedientemente a Su voluntad,
- y amar desinteresadamente como Cristo nos ama.

La Santa Voluntad del Padre nos guía

como a sus hijos. Nuestra conciencia nos ayuda a reconocer y seguir esta Voluntad Divina.

Nuestra conciencia es el juicio práctico de lo que es el bien y el mal y de cuál es la voluntad de Dios para nosotros. El Concilio Vaticano II enseñó, "En el fondo de su conciencia, el hombre descubre una ley que no se impone a sí mismo, pero que le obliga a obedecer". La formación de la conciencia, entonces, implica sintonizarse con la Verdad que Dios revela a la humanidad. La formación de la conciencia es un proceso continuo. Cada persona tiene la seria responsabilidad de promover este proceso de formación de su conciencia. Además, los padres tienen el grave deber de formar la conciencia de sus hijos.

¿Cómo promovemos la formación de la conciencia?

- Reconociendo la ley Natural, que corresponde a la naturaleza que el Creador dio a sus criaturas. Por ejemplo, la dignidad de la vida humana prohíbe el asesinato.
- Comprender la Ley Divina, que es la ley que Dios nos revela en las Escrituras, como los Diez Mandamientos y el Sermón de la Montaña de Jesús.
- Conocer y seguir la ley de la Iglesia que nos guía a aplicar la ley Divina de maneras particulares.
- ♦ Estudiar las enseñanzas de la Iglesia.
- Obediencia al derecho civil para el buen orden de la sociedad.
- ♦ Considerando WWJD ¿Qué haría Jesús?
- Reconocer qué es lo razonable a hacer.
- Considerar las consecuencias de una acción particular.
- ♦ Orando por guía




