My Body, Given Up for You

Today, with rose colored vestments, the Church observes the Fourth Sunday of Lent, known as Laetare Sunday. This name, 'Laetare,' comes from the first word of the Latin opening antiphon for today's Mass, 'Laetare,' —"Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning . . ." Although we too might be tempted to be in mourning, because of the brokenness of our human nature and the alienation we experience from God and one another, Jesus Christ is the hope of our joy.

Most of us have known the sadness, the emptiness, the heartbreak of death. These experiences result from an important person in our lives no longer continuing in relationship with us as before, and death can seem so final. Sin similarly disrupts our relationships with God and with others, resulting in sadness and a sense of loss. Yet today's liturgy refocuses our attention on the source of our joy, the LORD himself. The LORD himself has the power and desire to heal this

brokenness of relationships. From the LORD in a very clear manner comes our HOPE.

The unique relationship that God the Father desires with each of us, the relationship as his adopted children, comes to us in an extraordinary way through Jesus Christ. By means of the *New and Eternal Covenant*, we are cleansed of all sin, reconciled with God, and made a new creation—His adopted children. That covenant was instituted or begun on the Cross, so the Cross has become a symbol of God's great love.

John's Gospel today explains it this way: "'Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life.' For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son"

Jesus declared it even more clearly at the Last Supper: "This is my Body, which will be given up for you." This "given up" refers both to being nailed to the cross and to being offered up in sacrifice for the expiation of our sins. Clearly, then, the sacrifice of Christ's death on the cross is made available to us every day in the sacrifice of the Mass—"This is my Body, which will be given up for you." In the Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation that we are using for Lent, we hear it again, "Before his arms were outstretched between heaven and earth, to become the *lasting sign of your covenant."* The Eucharist enables us to participate in Christ's sacrifice and strengthens us in our covenant with the LORD.

Mi cuerpo, Entregado por Ti

Hoy, con vestimentas de color rosa, la Iglesia observa el Cuarto Domingo de Cuaresma, conocido como **Domingo** de Laetare. Este nombre, "Laetare", proviene de la primera palabra en latín de la antífona de entrada de la Misa de hoy, "Laetare": "Alégrate, Jerusalén y todos los que la aman. Alégrense todos los que estaban de luto. . . " Aunque nosotros también podríamos sentirnos tentados a estar de luto por el quebrantamiento de nuestra naturaleza humana y la alienación que experimentamos de Dios y de los demás, Jesucristo es la esperanza de nuestro gozo.

> La mayoría de nosotros hemos conocido la tristeza, el vacío, la angustia de la muerte. Estas experiencias son el resultado de una persona importante en nuestras vidas que ya no continúa en relación con nosotros como antes, y la muerte puede parecer tan definitiva. De manera similar, el pecado interrumpe nuestras relaciones con Dios y con los demás, lo que resulta en tristeza y una sensación de pérdida. Sin embargo, la liturgia de hoy vuelve a centrar nuestra atención en la fuente de nuestro gozo, el SEÑOR mismo. El SEÑOR mismo tiene el

poder y el deseo de sanar esta ruptura de relaciones. Del SEÑOR de una manera muy clara viene nuestra ESPERANZA.

La relación única que Dios Padre desea con cada uno de nosotros, la relación como sus hijos adoptivos, nos llega de manera extraordinaria a través de Jesucristo. Por medio del Alianza Nueva y Eterna, somos limpiados de todo pecado, reconciliados con Dios y hechos una nueva creación: Sus hijos adoptivos. Esa alianza se instituyó o comenzó en la Cruz, por lo que la Cruz se ha convertido en un símbolo del gran amor de Dios.

El evangelio de Juan de hoy lo explica de esta manera: "Así como Moisés levantó la serpiente en el desierto, así tiene que ser levantado el Hijo del hombre, para que todo el que crea en él tenga vida eterna. Porque tanto amó Dios al mundo, que le entregó a su Hijo único"

Jesús lo declaró aún más claramente en la Última Cena: "Este es mi Cuerpo, que será entregado por ustedes". Este "entregado" se refiere tanto a ser clavados en la cruz como a ser ofrecidos en sacrificio por la expiación de nuestros pecados. Claramente, entonces, el sacrificio de la muerte de Cristo en la cruz está disponible para nosotros todos los días en el sacrificio de la Misa: "Este es mi *Cuerpo*, que será entregado por ustedes". En la Plegaria Eucarística por la Reconciliación que usamos para la Cuaresma, lo escuchamos nuevamente: "Antes de que sus brazos extendidos entre el cielo y la tierra, trazasen el signo indeleble de tu alianza". La Eucaristía nos permite participar en el sacrificio de Cristo y nos fortalece en nuestra alianza con el SEÑOR. P. Allan F. Wolfe


